Program Spotlight Red Sox Scholars

Highland Street has partnered with the Red Sox Foundation for many years to support the Red Sox Scholars program, which provides 25 academically talented, but economically disadvantaged, 5th graders in the Boston Public Schools with college scholarships of \$10,000 each.

As part of the program, each of the Scholars receives access to tutoring and mentoring and other after-school enrichment activities during their middle school years. To help caravan the scholars to these activities, Highland Street recently provided funding for the purchase of a van, as seen below.
